Unit 1 Sept-Oct Half Term Amazing Africa	Unit 2 Oct – Feb Half Term Coasts and Conflict	Unit 3 Feb – May Half Term Energy and Resources	Unit 4 May - July Glaciation
<p>This unit is an introduction to development. It will show students that their perceptions of a place aren't always correct and that Africa as a continent is very unevenly developed.</p> <p>There will be a focus on the Sudan conflict and what life is like for people in different regions of Africa including the Horn of Africa.</p>	<p>A physical geography unit looking at the processes occurring at the coast line of the UK.</p> <p>Students will learn the different types of erosion, waves and how the landscape is shaped by these processes. The unit will end with some decision making exercises on how to manage the coastline for a sustainable future.</p>	<p>Where we get our energy from now and in the future is a hot debate; there is much research occurring to try and find alternatives to fossil fuels.</p> <p>This unit will teach students the costs and benefits of using fossil fuels vs alternative fuel. A focus on nuclear power towards the end of the unit will form the assessment.</p>	<p>A new unit to the national curriculum; to end the year students will look at cold environments and how glaciers are important to many people on the planet today and how they carved our landscapes millions of years ago.</p> <p>Students will also have an introduction to climate change and its role in the melting ice caps.</p>
