<p>Students will investigate the importance of religion in the Medieval period. They will explore the chronology of the crusades with focus on key battles and monarch's involvement.</p> <p>Skills used:  <b>Explanation of causes and effects.</b>  <b>Description of key events.</b>  <b>Source analysis.</b></p>	<p>Students begin by looking at the context of the Wars of the Roses and how Henry VII controlled England. This is followed by an exploration of the chronology of the Tudor Monarchs: Henry VII, Henry VIII, Edward and Mary. Students will focus on the religious changes which occur under each ruler and that monarch's style of rule. Key events in these reigns such as the establishment of the Church of England, burning of protestant martyrs will also be examined.</p> <p>Skills used:  <b>Explanation of causes and effects.</b>  <b>Description of key events.</b>  <b>Interpretation.</b></p>	<p>Students will focus mainly on Elizabethan England and the dilemmas which faced the Queen. We will examine the religious settlement, causes and consequences of the Spanish Armada and the question of succession. Students will compare and contrast Tudor Monarchs and come to a conclusion on who was the greatest Tudor Monarch.</p> <p>Skills Used:  <b>Explanation of causes and effects.</b>  <b>Description of key events.</b>  <b>Interpretation.</b>  <b>Source analysis and evaluation.</b></p>	<p>An exploration of the chronology of the English Civil War. Students will look into the causes of the conflict and the differences between the two sides. They will begin to look at the chronology of the war and which side was most likely to win.</p> <p>Skills Used:  <b>Explanation of causes and effects.</b>  <b>Description of key events.</b>  <b>Interpretation.</b>  <b>Source analysis.</b>  <b>Comparison.</b></p>	<p>Students will explore the reasons for the victory for the Parliamentarians, the rise of Cromwell and the execution of Charles I. Students will look into the impact of this on England and how it changed society forever.</p> <p>Skills used:  <b>Explanation of causes and effects.</b>  <b>Description of key events.</b>  <b>Interpretation.</b>  <b>Source analysis.</b></p>	<p>Students will explore the context and causes of the Slave Trade, who was involved and the process of the Slave Triangle. There will also be a focus on the lives of the slaves and how it was eventually abolished.</p> <p>Skills used:  <b>Explanation of causes and effects.</b>  <b>Description of key events.</b>  <b>Interpretation.</b>  <b>Source analysis.</b>  <b>Comparison</b></p>
